



Spring Forward – Crafton Clean Up Day! – Saturday April 29th

On Saturday, April 29th, Crafton Borough is hosting four related events meant to help you with your spring cleaning and help us redd-up and beautify the community! Crafton Park will host the Shredding and Medication Take Back event, a dumpster event, and a flower sale for Crafton Heritage. In addition, the Shade Tree Commission is running the Crafton Clean-up day, an official Pick-Up Pennsylvania event, where we invite you to join your neighbors in walking the community and picking up litter.

The FREE Paper Shredding & Medication Take Back event, hosted by State Representative Dan Deasy and State Senator Wayne Fontana, will be held in the swimming pool parking lot at Crafton Park from 8:00 to 11:00 am (or until the trucks are full). Please bring personal financial documents that are no longer needed and any other papers with confidential information such as account numbers and signatures. Documents will be shredded onsite! *No binders/binder clips or staples.*

The medication take-back event is hosted in partnership with the Allegheny County Sheriff's office and project D.U.M.P. Please bring any unused/unwanted prescription medication for safe disposal.

For our annual **Dumpster Day**, the Crafton Public Works crew will place several large dumpsters in the Crafton Park parking lot on Afton Ave, where you

will be able to drop off building materials, bulk items, household clutter, yard debris, and small appliances. They will NOT be collecting tires, auto-parts, refrigerators, ac units, paint, or other electronic waste. Crafton Residents only please.

When the Shredding event is wrapping up, Crafton Heritage will be setting up their **Flower Sale** at the stage in Crafton Park. See craftonheritage.org for ordering information. The deadline is April 19th. Your flowers will be available for pickup at the park. All proceeds will help Crafton Heritage and their work to preserve and celebrate Crafton's History. We will also work to ensure the mulch and compost bins are full, so you can pick some up for your new plants on your way out!

Finally, the Shade Tree commission is hosting **Crafton Clean-Up Day!** They will be starting from the Crafton Borough building at 9:00 am where they will be providing supplies to residents who plan to walk the community with us to pick up litter. We will be walking and picking up the trash that has accumulated over the winter, especially in alleyways, trails, and stairways. Please wear comfortable shoes and clothes that you are willing to get dirty. We will have some gloves and bags on hand. If you are a high school or college student that needs to log volunteer hours, this is a great way to earn some!

Zoning Update: Community Input Event Wednesday, April 19th

Crafton and Ingram Boroughs are working together with consultants to update our Zoning Ordinances, and we want to hear from you! After hearing comments from the Crafton Planning Commission and the Zoning Update Steering Committee, the consultants are preparing to share draft zoning maps and district descriptions with you to get your feedback. Please join us on Wednesday, April 19th at 5:30 pm at the Stage in Crafton Park* to provide your input.

A zoning ordinance is an important piece of legislation for local

government. It sets the rules for where and what someone can build on properties within its boundaries. For example, in some areas a property owner may only be permitted to build a single family home, but in others they are permitted to build a multifamily home like an apartment building. This allows municipal leaders to encourage development to happen in ways that benefit the community.

Pool News

Summer will be here before you know it!



Pool Pass Sales will begin May 1st

We encourage all our residents interested in visiting the Pool this summer to get a season pass. And this year we have made getting one even easier.

We have new software that will make it easier to register and pay online (once approved). You can still visit the Borough Office during normal business hours (Mon.- Fri. from 9 am to 4 pm) if you'd like some assistance with the process.

Whether you apply in person or online, you will now have a choice to either use a phone app as a digital pass or to continue to have a physical keychain tag.

This season we will be requiring photos be uploaded as an extra layer of security. It will allow us to double check season passholders at the door, whether they are using digital (phone) or physical (keychain tag) passes.

If you are choosing a physical pass, you will be able to pick it up at the Borough Building during office hours before the season begins. Once the season starts, you will be able to get it at the Pool.

The Pool is set to open on Memorial Day weekend (Saturday, May 27th) and the season will end on Labor Day weekend (Monday, Sept 4th). For detailed information about opening and closing times, season pass prices, eligibility, and other policies, please reference craftonborough.com/crafton-pool.



DID YOU KNOW? Even with all the pool passes and daily admissions, the pool does not pay for itself. The borough subsidizes the pool by "making up the difference" each year. This is pretty standard for most community pools.

Council President's Message

After one year as Council President, I continue to be grateful for the dedication by so many of you who want to see Crafton grow and thrive. This was evident at the pop-up Crafton Community Information Fair in January at the upcoming Fig

Tree Coffee shop. It was so great to see so many of our residents, elected officials, and staff attend to support our community and network with each other. As the weather gets warmer, I hope to see everyone enjoying all of Crafton's amenities and appreciate the opportunity to serve you.

Since the last newsletter, we have finished quite a few projects including:

1. **Borough Manager hired** – After an extensive nationwide search, Jim Price began in the role in January and has already made several process improvements and cost savings.
2. **Council Member appointed** – With the departure of Phillip Levasseur after many years of service, Council welcomed 10-year resident, Pamela Pulkownik, in January.
3. **2022 Financials** – The actual net income came within a few thousand dollars of the budget. We have been very cognizant of making sure all expenses align to the budget and what is needed for the community through fiscal responsibility.
4. **2023 Budget** – Staff and the Finance Committee presented a fair and conservative budget to Council in October which passed unanimously in December.
5. **Commission Vacancies** – Filled 19 open seats. For the new year, we have 10 openings upcoming for all residents to apply for consideration.
6. **Crafton Blvd. Sewer Separation, Parking Lot, and Streetscape** – The project has been completed with the addition of 8 streetlights. It should look beautiful come spring with the landscaping.

Mayor's Message

Getting invited to lots of community events is one of the best things about being Crafton Mayor. One of my favorites was visiting the first graders at Crafton Elementary school early last fall with Council President John Oliverio. They were already studying government and good citizenship and had loads of great questions.

I opened the Celebration of Lights program with Council President Oliverio – and even got to hang out with Elsa and Santa, too!

A huge thanks to the Recreation Board for their Holiday Giving Tree event for Crafton's seniors, to Hanlon's and the Library for hosting the trees, and all of our community members who so generously donated to the effort. I know all of the seniors who participated greatly appreciated the gifts. I attended the holiday coffee and gift event at Crafton Plaza and can attest to how much joy it brought to the residents. Thanks to everyone who played a part in that program!

There was the Rotary/Kiwanis jointly sponsored Casino Night at Crafton Plaza where our local Magistrate Jack Kobistek was one of the most popular game callers.

7. **Bradford Stop Sign** – Approved an ordinance to increase public safety at the heavy traffic intersection.

We are now working on the following projects:

1. **Crafton/Ingram Zoning Project** – ZoneCo presented the plan to the Planning Commission for further review by the community.
2. **2023 Road Paving Project** – The Engineers provided recommendations per the 5 year plan based on Robotics data for upcoming Council review and approval.
3. **Public Works Building, Magistrate Roof, and Borough Building/Library Façade** – Contractors continue to work on these structures.

Our future projects include:

1. **Pool Bathhouse** – Due to federal funding delays and elevated costs, scaled back updates to the bathhouse are planned after the 2023 pool season.
2. **Strategic Planning** – Council, Staff, and residents will be working on a Strategic Plan to prioritize future projects and initiatives.
3. **Grants** –
 - a. Awarded Alcosan's GROW grant of \$3.74M for the Broadhead Sewer Separation project.
 - b. Awarded House Rep. Lamb's Community Project Funding grant of \$991K for the Broadhead Sewer Separation project.

As a reminder, Council meetings are open to the public, and I encourage residents to attend (2nd and 4th Thursday of every month at 7:15 PM) in person or via Zoom to keep up to date on what is happening in our community.

Here's what's happening at Crafton Community Farm...



The Crafton Community Farm is not your ordinary community garden! Established in 2015, the garden is planted, mulched, watered, weeded and harvested by volunteers who then donate most of the produce to Crafton Ingram Food Pantry and others. With a generous support grant from The Allegheny Grows branch of Grow Pittsburgh, as well as ongoing cooperation with Crafton Borough, the garden is thriving. The amount of produce harvested has ranged from 1100-1400 pounds each growing season.

In 2022, we added more container plantings, and started a dedicated Childrens' Garden. We also put in some raised beds for people who have trouble getting down to ground level. We usually have free plants to give away in June, and we have plenty of seeds and gardening ideas to share with anyone in the community.

All produce is grown naturally and we don't use any pesticides or other chemicals. The crops grown include cucumbers, beets, peas, tomatoes, peppers, zucchini, ground cherries, strawberries, kale, beans, nasturtium and other edible flowers, lettuce, carrots, brussel sprouts, swiss chard, eggplant, okra, asparagus, squash, garlic, onions, pumpkins, and a variety of herbs. In the last couple years, we have gotten fruit from several varieties of berry bushes and our small fruit tree orchard, and we have started some interesting perennial crops such as sea kale, American Groundnut, horseradish, and rhubarb. Volunteers learn from each other and from professionals about the best way to grow, harvest, and even cook the produce!

Would you like to get involved? Anyone is welcome to join in garden activities. We can accommodate group visits. Hours at the garden are by appointment, but if you see a volunteer in the garden, don't hesitate to come in to see what is going on, and get a free taste of the freshest food in Crafton! Don't have a green thumb? No problem! We also need help with things like outreach and social media, manual labor, building, writing, and photography.

Be a Good Neighbor – Keep a Lid on It!

In the spirit of spring cleaning and brightening up the community, please take a moment this Spring to check out your trash area and make certain it's in compliance with local ordinances. All ordinances were passed to keep Crafton a safe and clean community.



- ➔ Make sure you have your items bagged and in cans with tight fitting lids.
- ➔ If you have a commercial property and have trash mixed with food waste in a dumpster, please make sure the lid is closed.
- ➔ On trash pick-up day, place your cans out and put them back within 24 hours of pick-up.
- ➔ Please remove any loose trash around your trash storage area and any appliances or uncut tree trunks/tree debris.
- ➔ Cans are to be stored in the rear or if along the side screened from view—never in the front.
- ➔ Unused building materials cannot be stored indefinitely and must be removed as well.
- ➔ Regularly collect your pet waste and place it bagged in cans or compost it as it attracts rodents.
- ➔ Make sure your recycling cans are clear of food debris so that the collectors can follow their protocols for pick-up of your items.

As always, if you have an issue with a neighbor, please contact them and try to work it out. If you cannot reach an amicable resolution, feel free to contact the Code Official's office Monday to Friday between 9:00 am and 3:00 pm or submit a complaint online through our service request form. All complaints are kept confidential.

Permit Requirements & Inspection Reminders

With warmer weather approaching, we often start digging into outdoor projects, such as building a deck, erecting a fence, or adding that shed to clear out your basement, finally! Here are some friendly reminders when it comes to those types of projects.

Zoning Compliance – A zoning permit is required for outdoor projects like sheds, fences, retaining walls, and parking pads. It is the property owner's responsibility to apply for a permit and to have the permit in hand before any type of work is started.

Occupancy Permit – Per Crafton Borough Ordinance No. 1673, during any change of occupancy, rental, or sale in any dwelling unit or commercial property the affected unit/s must be inspected and an occupancy permit issued before the properties can be occupied.

Annual Commercial Property Inspections – The fire marshal will begin conducting the annual fire safety inspections on commercial properties and multi-family structures. These annual inspections allow the fire marshal to check for safety issues and to update pre-plans of the building for the fire department. Findings of the safety inspection are given to the property and business owner so that the issues can be corrected.
