Tuesday July 25th, 2023

THE BOARD OF BUTTE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS CONVENED AT 9:50 A.M. on July 25th, 2023. Commissioners present were Harms, Ager, Walton, Herman, and Erk.

Chairperson Harms called the meeting to order and led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Erk, Second by Ager to approve the meeting agenda with moving Public Comments from the end of the meeting to the beginning. Chairman Harms said he instructed Capp to move public comments permanently to the beginning of the meeting. Vote Unanimous. Motion Carried.

Public Comments began at 9:53

 Sue Broadhurst said after further research, she misspoke at the last meeting when she believed that Butte County was the only county to hold Public Comments at end of agenda.
 Ms. Broadhurst asked that the public be given any items open to the public in public packets based on SDCL 1-27-1.16.

Motion Ager, Second Walton to approve Center of Nation Cannabis Manufacturing License Renewal application. A roll call vote was held with Erk – Nay, Herman – Aye, Walton – Aye, Ager – Aye, Harms - Aye. Vote four ayes, one nay. Motion Carried.

Motion Walton, Second Herman to approve Center of Nation Cannabis Cultivation License Renewal application. Erk – Nay, Herman – Aye, Walton – Aye, Ager – Aye, Harms - Aye. Vote four ayes, one nay. Motion Carried.

Motion Herman Second Ager to approve High Plains Cannabis Cultivation License Renewal application. Erk – Nay, Herman – Aye, Walton – Aye, Ager – Aye, Harms - Aye. Vote four ayes, one nay. Motion Carried.

Motion Walton, Second Ager to approve Rushmore Cannabis Care LLC Cultivation License Renewal application. Erk – Nay, Herman – Aye, Walton – Aye, Ager – Aye, Harms - Aye. Vote four ayes, one nay. Motion Carried.

Discussions were held regarding the 2024 Provisional Budget with department heads

- Highway Superintendent Heidrich presented the proposal for the Weed and Pest department- wages are for 40 hours to attend conferences, contract out for spraying under professional services. Budget reduced from 2023.
- Highway Superintendent Heidrich presented the proposal for Road and Bridge department reductions made were to remove computer, new mag water process, minor equipment for a packer, lowered culverts request, and removed travel.
- Jasen Saivong presented the proposal for Veteran Service budget additional travel requested as well as split rent costs with Emergency Management for printer
- Auditor Capp presented the proposal for the Extension budget additional travel requested for Cindy Riley to attend State Fair, professional services increased due to increase in County share to supplement Michelle May's wage. Lawrence County contribution was discussed.

- Register of Deeds Brunner presented the proposal for the Register of Deeds and Modernization budgets - minimal changes, increases in personnel are due to deputy moving to full wage, travel and supplies decreased. Commissioner Harms mentioned that Register of Deeds is one of the only departments that almost fund themselves.
- Auditor Capp presented the proposal for the County Nurse and WIC budgets minimal changes
- Treasurer Lensegrav presented the proposal to the Treasurer office budget Part-time and seasonal employee requests were removed.
- Director of Equalization and Deputy Director Cristina Wilson presented the proposal for the Director of Equalization/Planning budgets - professional service budgets were adjusted for both budgets. Reductions made in repair and maintenance and supplies and materials.
- States Attorney McCartney presented the proposal for the State's Attorney and Judicial budgets SA McCartney lowered travel and conference budget and professional services was lowered by \$4,000 as these funds were moved to Judicial. Auditor Capp discussed the Personnel portion of the budget as supervisor of employee processing liens. Increase in rentals is in anticipation of increased cost for space and/or moving to larger location

A short recess was called at 11:10 A.M. Meeting called back in order at 11:20 A.M.

- Sheriff Lamphere presented the proposal for the Dispatch –Sheriff Lamphere expressed his support of addition of skill levels and importance for retention, longevity increase, and family insurance rates for replacement employees.
- Sheriff Lamphere presented the proposal for the Sheriff/Jail/Coroner/Regional Juvenile
 Detention/Emergency Management/24/7 budgets Wage increase included addition of skill
 levels, longevity increase, and family insurance rates for replacement employees. Travel
 and Conference reduced to \$7500 and increase minor equipment to \$2500. LEPC included
 in Emergency Management. Reduction in 24/7 due to removal supervisor stipend.
- Auditor Capp presented the proposal for Elections budget Salary decrease, all other increases were due to upcoming Presidential election needs. Travel decreased
- Auditor Capp presented the proposal for Auditor budget Wage decrease due to absorption
 of Accounts payable position into Deputy Auditor II role and Office Manager. Additional
 decreases in Repairs and Maintenance, Supplies and Materials, and Travel and Conference
- Auditor Capp presented the proposal for Court Appointed Attorney expenses moved from one line item to another with no changes to total budget.
- Auditor Capp presented the proposal for Insurance budget increase of 8%
- Auditor Capp presented the proposal for Butte County Buildings budget increase was due
 to moving part time employee to full time and travel expenses needed, reduction in supplies
 and materials and repairs and maintenance.
- Auditor Capp presented the proposal for IT budget lowered professional services
- Auditor Capp presented the proposal for Care of Poor, Mentally III, Mentally Illness Board budget, Debt Service, Operating Transfers budgets and explained any differences in requests
- Auditor Capp presented the proposal for Commissioners and Commissioners Contingency no increase in wages for commissioners or commissioner assistant and remove technology reimbursement. No changes to Commissioners Contingency
- The following distributions were discussed, Action for Betterment of Community (ABC), Ambulance (101-5-424-423) no amount requested yet, Artemis House (Domestic Abuse) (229-5-434), Behavioral Management Services (BMS) (101-5-441-422), Belle Fourche Chamber of Commerce Reduce 25%, Black Hills Transit, Black Hills Council On Local Govt, Butte/Lawrence County Fair (101-5-524), Butte County Fire (211-5-221), CASA (Judicial 101-5-130-429), Compass Point, Dakota Abilities (101-5-442-422), Economic Development (101-5-715), Library (220-5-511), Predator Animal (101-5-166), Soil Conservation (101-5-612), Teen Court (101-5-160), addition of Black Hills Childrens Home Society

Auditor Capp presented three 2024 Longevity Wage Scale options and explained the differences between the current scale and the 3 options provided.

- o 3% Increase with steps for Sheriff and Dispatch,
 - 3% increase for all elected, appointed, and hourly employees
 - Incorporated most "other roles" into the positions they fall under
 - Shifted some positions for appointed positions under the commissioner title
 - Includes skill levels for Sheriff office and hourly vs salary for deputies
 - Change of Deputy Auditor I to Senior Sworn Deputy (5+ year's experience)
 - Includes skill levels for Dispatch office
- o 0% Increase with steps for Sheriff and Dispatch
 - Same changes as above without 3% increase employees
- 0% increase no steps for Sheriff and Dispatch
 - No increase for any employees
 - Incorporated most "other roles" into the positions they fall under
 - Shifted some positions for appointed positions under the commissioner title
 - Changed salaried deputies to hourly
 - Change of Deputy Auditor I to Senior Sworn Deputy (5+ years' experience)

Discussion was held on the move from salary to hourly for Sheriff Deputies. The conversation focused on the hourly rate conversion and the inclusion of overtime difference between salary and hourly wages.

Discussion was held regarding potentially adding State's Attorneys office personnel, such as paralegals, separate from General Staff as they are more specialized roles.

Discussion was held regarding longevity steps and need based on experience. All increases are to be performance based, at the discretion of the supervisor, and require final commission approval.

Discussion was held regarding looking at alternate insurance options. Auditor's office will send a benefits survey to employees regarding pay, insurance, and other benefits.

Motion Ager, Second Walton to approve 2024 Provisional Budget with changes agreed upon. Auditor Capp will provide totals to commissioners and file them with Department of Revenue. Capp will also provide a five-year history between provisional and actual budgets. Vote Unanimous. Motion Carried

Motion Walton, Second Herman to approve 2024 Wage Scale with a 3% Increase, skill levels for Sheriff and Dispatch, Office Supervisor, and Sr. Sworn Deputy changes. 3% increase will not apply to commissioners or commissioner assistant. Vote Unanimous. Motion Carried

Motion Herman, Second Walton to Adjourn at 2:02 PM. Vote Unanimous. Motion Carried

THE BOARD OF BUTTE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS CONVENED AT 9:30 A.M. on August 1, 2023. The meeting was recorded. Commissioners present were Harms, Ager, Walton, Herman, and Erk.

Motion by Herman, Second by Ager to approve the meeting agenda with removal of item 7 Joyce Bucholz and addition of Pivot Point West River Mental Health Facility under Sheriff Office. Vote Unanimous; Motion Carried.

Motion by Walton, Second by Ager to approve minutes of 18July2023 Regular Meeting Minutes with no changes. Vote Unanimous. Motion Carried.

Motion by Ager, Second by Herman to approve the Bills for Payment as presented by Auditor Annie Capp. Vote Unanimous. Motion Carried. Claim # was pulled for review and determined it was coded incorrectly under E911 (should be highway). Approval Sheet signed by all Commissioners and Auditor.

Motion by Herman, Second by Ager to approve payment of Apportioning and Other payments per Printout as presented by Auditor Annie Capp with no changes. Vote Unanimous. Motion Carried. Approval Sheet signed by all Commissioners.

Motion by Walton, Second by Herman to approve Travel Request as presented with no changes. Vote Unanimous. Motion Carried.

• Treasurer and Auditor – Debbie Lensegrav, Kelly Keegan, Annie Capp, and Lisa Nelson, to attend 2023 SDACO fall Convention in Sioux Falls, SD from September 11-13, 2023.

There were no Abatements.

Beginning at 9: AM an opportunity for Public Comment was opened.

- Travis Ismay stated that the four of the commissioners violated his first amendment rights at the 25Jul2023 meeting. Mr. Ismay asked the commissioners to research what it allowed during public comments. Mr. Ismay said he was sorry he got angry at the last meeting. Mr. Ismay said that marijuana supporters considered marijuana their Savior and that is how he correlated being a Christian and supporting marijuana.
- Kellen Willert spoke about people saying they represent all people in the community when in fact misrepresenting people. Mr. Willert said that during one of the last meetings he attended there was someone was removed, and the commissioners were in the right to do that based on that person's behavior. Mr. Willert suggested that Public Comments be placed at the end of the so the Commissioners could conduct all business first and not hold up county employees' time. Mr. Willert encouraged the commissioners to broadcast meetings. Lastly, Mr. Willert urged the commissioners to listen to the Pivot Point information to be provided by Sheriff Lamphere, citing the mental health epidemic.

Veterans Service Officer, Jasen Saivong, presented an activity report including disability compensation claims, spousal death, discharge papers, home loan assistance, and DAV transportation numbers. Mr. Saivong said he will be meeting with the Treasurer's office regarding Veterans Exemption forms. Governor declared August 7, 2023, Purple Heart Recognition day. 1.8 million have received a purple heart since its inception.

Highway superintendent, Dwayne Heidrich, presented an activity report including mowing, fixing roads, hauling gravel. Mr. Heidrich said they also took care of some things at the fairgrounds prior to fair.

Heidrich presented the Butte County Structure Grant (BIG) information. Box Culverts installed and construction on next culvert.

Commissioner Herman asked if there was signage to post regarding semi-trucks going across bridges. Heidrich recommended notifying Sheriff's Office.

Deputy States Attorney Edward Tarbay presented an activity report including preparation for rally, Meade county court schedule is Sunday thru Sunday during Rally, increase in days for court trials, upcoming jury trials running from early August through October, increase in driving under the influences, and jail residents. Two Grand Jury dates are set during the rally.

Sheriff Lamphere provided an update on a joint facility between the City of Belle Fourche and Butte County. Sheriff Lamphere said the ShopKo building came up for sale and Elevatus has been asked to come look at the building and provide plans based on use of that building.

Sheriff Lamphere shared the agreement for Elevatus for Conceptual and Programming study for a Joint Facility and reasoning for the "good faith" agreement with Elevatus.

Motion by Ager, Second by Erk to approve signing of agreement between Butte County and Elevatus for \$6,000 to continue to work on plans for a joint facility. Vote Unanimous. Motion Carried.

Sheriff Lamphere provided information on Pivot Point facility. The facility will have 16 beds for full committals and 8 additional short term for up to 24-hour stays at a rate of \$260.00 a day. There will be a Memorandum of Understanding with BMS Cares and counties using facilities in the future.

Auditor Capp presented an activity report including July building activities, last SOS regarding post-election audit meeting to be held 22Aug2023, and scheduled meeting Indigent Funding to be held 13Sep2023.

Motion Ager, Second Herman to enter Executive Session for Personnel 10:14 AM. Vote Unanimous. Motion Carried. Executive Session ended 10:20 AM. No Action taken



Design Exception (further explanation).

The hydraulic analysis has been prepared ensuring that the proposed options will either meet or slightly exceed the crossing's current level of service.

Calculations indicate the current roadway overtops at about the 7-year storm event. During our analysis it became apparent that achieving the 'design headwater 1' below subgrade shoulder' standard would require raising the road grade through the overtopping section and would cause the 100-year water surface elevation to increase. Any significant increase is undesirable. This increase has the capability to magnify potential contraction scour which can usually be countered by lengthening the structure opening. In this particular case, the existing channel geometry has more of an effect on the design water surface elevation than the length of the structure opening. It is apparent that it could take considerable channel reshaping, road grading, and a significantly larger structure to set the current design headwater elevation to 1' below subgrade shoulder in the roadway overtop section while still satisfying other design criteria.

The low traffic count and existing topography are the reasons the County is requesting a variance in the design frequency from a 10-year storm to meeting the current level of service and to ensure similar flow performance through the structure as compared to the existing structure up to and including the overtopping event.
